It's important to take time and remember all of the things to be thankful for that many of us take for granted. The following letter arrived from one of our members, Rosienid Pere of Puerto Rico, who survived Hurricane Maria:

October 23, 2017

MSW Members c/o Mary Anne Garnett, Membership Chairperson

Dear Mary Anne:

Thank you so much for your note [included with her membership renewal].

My family and I are safe, but our lives have changed very much. The modern island with the best technology, universities, hotels, beautiful sites, full of colors, flowers, birds and so many species are almost gone. All the electrical system has collapsed and most of the countries (cities) don't have water. The farmers lost everything, so we won't have local products for a long time. Just imagine yourself without electricity, water, washing machine, television, internet, cellular phones. No matter where you live or how pretty your home is you feel lost in space. We are dealing with that.

Nobody could be prepared for the devastation Hurricane Maria left us. I cried everyday hearing in my portable radio the people claiming for food and water. There are still many people in-communicated. Helicopters from the Navy, FEMA and others throw them some food and water regularly. We are receiving a lot of help, but it is like starting all over again. It will take many years to have and to live the way we used to. We are having some progress. Two weeks ago the water was reestablished at home. All the communications companies are united repairing the optic cable for the cellular phones. In some places there is electricity giving the service first to hospitals. Everybody is trying to return to 'normality' by using electrical plants.

I hope to be able to participate by sending some of my work to an exhibit of MSW in a future. We are having a difficult time but will get over it.

With all my love from an artist that painting is keeping her motivated and looking forward for a better future,

Sheila Parsons- Conway includes Perry, Conway, and Faulkner Counties Parsons: MSW has been a professional artist and workshop instructor since 1976. She received her master's degree in art from the prestigious Pratt Institute in New York and has studied since then with some of the greats in the watercolor field. She has been an assistant to Milford Zornes on over 30 watercolor workshops and has led her own workshops all across the United States, in Italy, Ireland, Mexico, Wales, Greece, Spain and France.

Her work is included in public and private collections in Europe, Mexico and the USA. She does vibrant and colorful paintings of landscapes, florals and street scenes. She is a signature member of the Mid-Southern Watercolorists, a member of Oklahoma Watercolor Association and Midwest Watercolor Association and has served on the faculty of the Arkansas Arts Center. Her work has been included in Watercolor USA, Mid-Southern WC annual and other national shows. Her paintings are in corporate and private collections throughout the United States, Mexico and Europe. Sheila received the Arkansas Governor's Award for Outstanding Individual Artist. The Fall 2000 issue of Watercolor, an American Artist publication, had an eight page feature article about Sheila and her paintings. She received a Lifetime Achievement in the Arts Award from the Faulkner County (Arkansas) in 2010.She currently lives and works with her husband, Richard Talley.



Bill Branch, Memphis, Tenn. and also includes Lee, Phillips, Monroe, Arkansas Counties and surrounding area. He is a native Arkansan who is retired and lives in Memphis, Tennessee. Bill has been painting most of his life. He has studied art at University of Central Arkansas and at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. She is a painter who loves the outdoors and all living things. Birds, water, fish, animals, sunsets, misty mornings are all scenes taken from actual experiences in her life outdoors. She grew up in Kansas and received early training from watercolorists around the Wichita area. She has experimented with acrylics and oils, but prefers watercolor. As a child, weekends were spent enjoying the outdoors, drawing and painting, and this love of the outdoors has carried on throughout her life.

After coming to Arkansas, she worked for many years professionally in management and accounting. Following her retirement in Washington, D.C. from a major "Fortune Five" corporation, she returned to Arkansas and pursued her creativity more seriously, continuing to learn, to experiment and to paint more watercolors. Her paintings primarily memorialize actual moments that she has personally experienced from the outdoors, but often she experiments with colors, shapes, lines and forms to express feelings of the moment. She likes for her paintings to make people feel good.

Ms. Fry received her Bachelor of Art Education Degree Magna Cum Laude from Wichita State University and her Master of Arts Degree from Michigan State University. She is included in the Artist's Book of Arkansas Artists called "A Gathering of Artists", published by the Hot Springs Fine Arts Center. She has exhibited her watercolors in various exhibitions in Central Arkansas sponsored by the Mid-Southern Watercolorists and other local venues, including the Arkansas Arts Center, Laman Library Galleries, Cantrell Gallery, Historic Arts Museum and the Arkansas Repertory Theatre, Little Rock. She is a Past President and a current board member of the Mid-Southern Watercolorists.



FROM SKETCHBOOK TO STUDIO PAINTING LIGHT IN WATERCOLOR



Through demonstration, thoughtful critique, and lessons learned over a long painting career lain will help you understand how to prepare for and anticipate the challenges that painting in watercolor presents. By guiding you through his process which relies on simplification of subject through exploratory sketching and value studies lain will demonstrate how to create a road map, that if followed, will greatly improve your painting. Iain's purpose is to provide you with a **repeatable process involving carefully planned steps** that you can use for painting any subject. Students will follow lain in group demonstrations from photographs provided by lain or life - more experienced painters are encouraged to work from their own photography. The class setting is very relaxed and accommodating to all quite often with a broad mix of experience and skill levels represented. Most importantly, lain allows as much time as possible for one on one instruction and critique. After all a workshop should focus on the student and not how well the instructor can paint. In the end it's about you and your experience and whether it will help you to continue on your artistic journey.

The fee for this 4-day workshop is \$280. Donation for the demo at the MSW meeting, Wednesday, February 21st is \$5. If you would like to pay for both, you may send a check in the amount of \$285. Please make your check payable to MSW. Enrollment is on a first-come first-served basis after this notice is posted in the MSW Views and Website. Space is limited to 20 artists. We will open enrollment to non-members only if our membership does not fill the class.
